Job Purpose

To contribute to the academic, professional, research and administrative activities associated with the MSc in Applied Positive Psychology and Coaching Psychology programme, the Professional Psychology Department, and the School of Psychology.

Duties and Responsibilities

- 1. To undertake research and scholarly activity and contribute to the general research life and activities of the Professional Psychology Department and the School.
- 2. To make substantial contribution to our MSc in Applied Positive Psychology and Coaching Psychology (MAPPCP), on campus and via Distance Learning modes of delivery particularly related to research.
- 3. To provide research supervision at postgraduate levels across the Department.
- 4. To design, develop and review teaching materials.
- 5. To identify best and innovative practices in learning and teaching research methods and build these into personal teaching practice.
- 6. To co-ordinate students' research activities and learning in the MSc in Applied Positive Psychology and Coaching Psychology (MAPPCP)
- 7. To design a coherent plan for our students' research activities and to manage the allocation of research supervisors.
- 8. To conduct and help to disseminate the outputs of high quality research produced by our team and our students.
- 9. To be committed to ensuring that research has impact beyond academia.

- 10. To attend Assessment Boards and other committees, etc. as necessary and contribute to the academic administration of the School, for example recruitment functions, open days etc., as required
- 11. To undertake a role in the School of Psychology and in general contribute to the School as a Senior Lecturer
